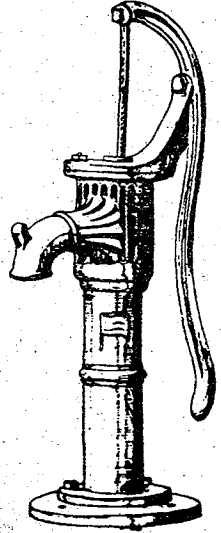

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The Parish Council were disappointed at the failure of their recent attempts to prevent the spread of refuse tipping in the valley. The Public Protection Committee of Avon County Council granted a new licence for the recommencement of tipping on plot 199, off Weston Drove, in spite of repeated objections.

The apparent problem is that the planning permission which had been granted for the plot as long ago as 1952 was not subject to a time limit. The County Council are under a duty to grant a licence where such a planning permission exists, and have very little power to refuse to do so.

Investigations are still proceeding to establish whether the tip on plot 186 is higher than is permitted under the terms of its planning permission.

The Parish Council has expressed concern to Woodspring District Council over the state of the building and waste land

adjoining the access to the Court Farm development. Woodspring have served Notice under Section 65 of the Town and Country Planning Acts requiring the owner to improve the site, but the matter is now under appeal in the magistrates' court.

Similar representations have been made to Woodspring over the deteriorating state of the Old Barn near the church. Woodspring are taking steps to secure urgent repairs to this Grade II listed building.

Various minor matters have occupied the Council's time, such as the maintenance of footpaths and the provision of road nameplates which will shortly identify Hill Lane and Silver Street.

The Parish will seek a rate precept of £1,500 for the coming year, of which £500 will be allocated towards the street lighting conversion programme. This scheme, although initially costly, will dramatically improve parish finances over the next few years as it progresses.

The annual Parish Meeting will take place on Tuesday 24th April.

Parish Council meetings are scheduled for May 8th, June 5th and July 3rd.

OTHER EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

We are presently trying to obtain a repair estimate and hope to hold a demonstration (visiting team) and talk in the summer. We would also like to know the history of these bells.
