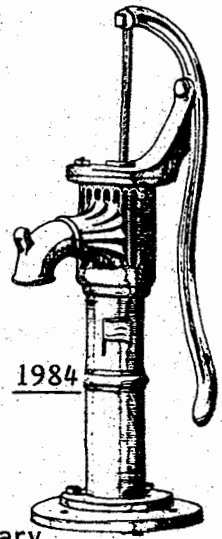

CHURCH OF ST. PETER & ST. PAUL

It is with deep regret that we have to report the sudden death of the Reverend William Ronald Thaw Marriott, on Tuesday 21st August, 1984 at the age of 68, at the Rectory, All Saints Lane, Clevedon.

Since 1968 he had been Vicar of All Saints, East Clevedon. In 1971 he became Curate-in-Charge of Weston-in-Gordano; in 1980 Curate-in-Charge of Clapton-in-Gordano and in 1982 Rector of Walton St. Mary and Walton-in-Gordano St. Paul, becoming Rector of the United Benefice of the Five Churches.

Born in Sheffield in January 1916, he first studied chemistry, becoming a pharmacist, and saw active service in India and the Far East during the Second World War.

After demobilisation he went to Chichester Theological College. His love of music was fully exploited there, for he served as Assistant Organist whilst studying for the Ministry. After Ordination he served his title in the Diocese of Derby before moving to Bournemouth, thence as Vicar of St. Saviour's, Poplar, London, coming to All Saints, Clevedon, in March 1968.

Father Marriott, as he was known to many, took a keen interest in the music of the church, and one of his first accomplishments on his arrival in Clevedon, was the reconstruction of the Father Willis Organ at All Saints.

He was a member of the Royal Horticultural Society, and one of his joys in life was to be in his garden.

He leaves a brother and a sister-in-law.

The Harvest Festival on Sunday 23rd September was conducted by the Reverend Prebendary E.P. James, who will be responsible for Weston-in-Gordano and All Saints, Clevedon, until a new appointment of Rector of the United Benefice of the Five Churches is made.

Our thanks to everyone who made the service such a joyful occasion, which was enjoyed by a large congregation.

The gifts of produce etc., were gratefully received by the Salvation Army Eventide Home in Elton Road. Thank you, everyone who contributed.

Our Annual Garden Fete held at the home of Mr. and Mrs Jeremy Carrad, was a great success, raising the sum of £600 towards the upkeep of our Village Church.

The date of the Carol Service will be announced later. The December Family Service this year will be taking the form of a traditional Lessons & Carols service and will be candlelit.

VILLAGE HALL

Our next priority has to be the installation of a new fixed heating system to meet Fire Officer requirements, and, with the winter rapidly advancing, efforts are in hand to speed up the installation. However, present estimates for the task range from £350 to £800 and the Hall funds have been seriously depleted to meet the recent requirements in the Hall. We therefore hope to be able to run a few events to cover the new heating and we look for and need your support in our endeavours.

The regular Wine and Cheese evening will be held on Saturday 24th November at 7.30 p.m. for 8.00 p.m. Tickets will soon be on sale at £1.75 to include food and a glass of wine. Further wine will, of course, be on sale so please book this date in your calendars for another very enjoyable evening.
