

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The additional street light at the west end of the village has now been installed and is working adjacent to Church Cottage.

The Council has been requested to provide a street light at the junction of Cadbury Halt and Cadbury Lane. The cost of providing this light would be more than £400, and in view of this the occupants of the surrounding properties are to be canvassed to establish whether a light is required.

The Highways Department have recently notified the Council that they have encountered difficulties in negotiating the purchase of the strips of land needed to implement the road improvement scheme. It appears that compulsory purchase proceedings are likely to be necessary, and as this will take some time it is probable that the scheme, currently in the budget for 1986/7, will now be deferred to a later year.



The community policeman, P.C. Mackie, who is a regular attender at Parish Council meetings, has advised the Council that there have been a number of daytime burglaries in the neighbourhood. Villagers are asked to take care over the security of their own premises, and also to be on their guard and to promptly report any suspicious activity in the village.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held in the village hall on Wednesday 30th October at 7.30 p.m. Parishioners are welcome to all meetings and time is made available at the beginning of the evening for questions to be asked.
