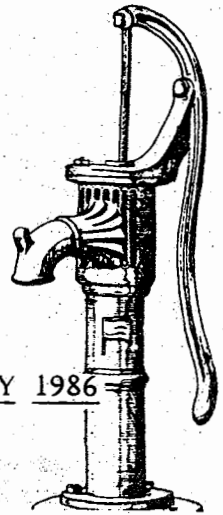

PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

Councillors have been disturbed to note the length of time taken to acquire the necessary land for the improvements to the B3124 at the west end of the village. Reports from the owners of the plots involved suggest that Avon County Council have been dragging their heels in this matter. Representations have been made on the subject, but at present the scheme remains in the budget for 1988/89. The Council are co-operating fully with the Weston-in-Gordano Road Action Group in trying to expedite the improvement scheme.

The Old School has again been the subject of concern, since there has been considerable deterioration of late, especially in the roof. As there is thought to be serious risk of tiles falling on people visiting the Village Hall, the District Council are being approached in an attempt to have the building made secure.

The Parish Council have supported moves to establish a Local Plan for the Gordano Valley area, in the hope of strengthening the arm of the planning committees in opposing undesirable development in the valley.

Various matters in Cadbury Lane have been occupying Councillors' time of late. It is proving difficult to pin down responsibility for the uneven road surface, between the different contractors who have dug trenches. However, the new street light is currently being installed and should soon be in use.

The community policeman, P.C. Mackie, has been unable to solve the Riddle of the Stolen Conifers. The trees in question, which were recently planted in front of the electricity sub-station in Cadbury Lane, disappeared on or about November 5th or 6th. Inquiries show that they did not form part of the village bonfire!

The biggest event was surely the Pantomime Aladdin, produced by Mrs Connie Williams. For several weeks there were individual and small group rehearsals in private houses then suddenly it all began to happen. Materials, dresses and how many kimonos were arriving at Stoneycroft, Hill Lane; rehearsals taking place in the Hall (which was being miraculously transformed under the direction of Mr. Geoff Williams); the handi-work of Messrs Redway, Biddle, Alexander, Instone and Streames produced stage curtains, lights, backdrops, props, sound equipment etc. - it was all there. Special thanks are due to Mr. Jim Sulley for loan of pallets and Mr. Wilson Bray for donating sheets of hardboard.

Having announced the date of the Pantomime (Saturday 18th January) the tickets were so quickly sold that it was obvious there must be another performance on the Friday. There were 'House Full' notices on both nights and it is suggested the Hall could have been filled for a third. For a population of approximately 260 this is an excellent response - but it was an excellent performance representing hard work, enthusiastic effort and fun by all concerned.

The script in verse written by Mr. Paul Alexander (with additions by Mr. David Lewis) was magnificently interpreted by a cast of all ages. This effort involved whole families and most of the village youngsters including pianist and "lights". This in itself made the event a worthwhile exercise.

It is hoped that similar happenings might take place as an interest has been expressed by would-be participants - more news in this direction later.
