

PARISH CHURCH OF ST. PETER & ST. PAUL

We are busy preparing for our first ever Flower Festival from June 27th - 29th. A team of flower arrangers have been assembled under the experienced direction of Mrs. Fowles and plans are in hand for a Summer Evening Concert and Buffet on the Saturday evening. Tickets for this will shortly be on sale price £2.00. The Theme of the Festival is 'All glory laud and honour'. The official opening will be by Mr and Mrs Jeremy Carrad. Our Parish Church will be open each day from 10.00 a.m. to 9.00 p.m. for viewing the floral arrangements. As part of the Festival Weekend there will also be a display of Village Arts and Crafts in the Village Hall. This will also be the venue for refreshments, including Ploughmans Lunches and Strawberry Teas throughout the weekend. The proceeds of the Festival will be shared between our Church Fabric Fund and Christian Aid. The weekend also coincides with the Patronal Festival. PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

The Parish Council retired recently, and two of our number did not seek re-election.

David Quas had been a Councillor for the past eleven years, three of them as Chairman. His knowledge and experience will be much missed, especially in the field of environmental matters. Business pressures, involving spending much of his time in London, make it impossible for him to continue in office.

and on Long Ashton R.D.C. In recognition of her outstanding contribution to parish affairs, in this and several other spheres, a small presentation was made to her on April 29th. at the Annual Parish Assembly.

Road Improvement Scheme

It has recently become clear that the scheme has been put back in the County Council's estimates to 1990/1. The Council have been assured that this is solely due to difficulties in acquiring the necessary land, which is proceeding to Compulsory Purchase proceedings and will almost certainly involve a Local Enquiry.

Avon say that, should the land become available more easily than anticipated, the scheme will be brought forward again. They also insist that there are no plans to alter the agreed scheme for provision of footpaths without drastically changing the character of the village.

Planning

Applications have been considered, and recommendations made, in respect of:

Extension to 1 Hill Lane - approved

Storage of caravans at Weston Lodge Farm - refused.

Oral evidence was given over two days at the Examination in Public of the County Structure Plan First Alteration.

The Green Belt Subject Plan will be up for discussion soon, and a major item of interest to the Parish will be the proposal to abandon the village fence around Weston-in-Gordano. The effect of this, it is believed, will be to make the village part of the Green Belt, and therefore subject to more stringent planning control than at present.

Finance

The precept for the coming year will be £960, an increase of 4%.

New Council

The new Parish Council, returned unopposed, consists of Messrs. Biddle, Lewis and Williams as previous, and Jim Sulley and Basil Tyler who replace the retiring members.

The first meeting of the new council will take place on Wednesday May 20th at 7.30 p.m. in the village hall.

Parishioners are reminded that time is made available to them at the beginning of each meeting to ask questions and make comments. Parish Council meetings are all open to the public and villagers are encouraged to take an interest in Parish affairs.

THE GORDANO VALLEY SEWAGE DISPOSAL SCHEME
