

#### NEW PLACES, NEW FACES

The Avon Community Council's Mobile Information Service is now entering it's fourth year of existance. Our newly appointed information Officer 'Babs Greenwood' has endless enthusiasm and has already helped countless people with their problems.

New timetables have just been launched for the months October to January. Six new villages have been incorporated into the schedule of stops. They are Oldbury on Severn, Timsbury, High Littleton, Hallatrow, Falfield and Cromhall. Hopefully this will help more people who are unable to gain access to existing information services.

The mobile is an 'R' registered ambulance that has been converted to carry as many leaflets as possible and to enable confidential one-to-one conversations with the Information Officer. The range of information carried has been made deliberately broad to cater for the needs of as many people as possible. The service carries leaflets on leisure attractions, brochures for Colston Hall, Bristol Hippodrome, Bath Theatre Royal among others. It also carries health, consumer and DHSS leaflets. All the leaflets and the advice are free. The information is updated constantly to provide the best service possible.

Enquiries recorded during the months January to October were 1,251. It is hoped that with the addition of the new villages more enquiries will be recorded in the months to come, thus proving the effectiveness of the service.

#### PARISH COUNCIL NOTES

##### Local Plan

A well attended village meeting was held on 11th November 1987. Mr C Mitchell from Woodspring Planning Dept. addressed us and described the proposed Area Local Plan and in particular how it would affect Weston-in-Gordano. Many questions were raised and satisfactorily answered and the general feeling was that the Plan was welcomed. The Parish Council have approved the Plan, and it was stated that future planning applications would be considered in the light of this plan - that means that the whole village is considered "Green Belt". New Buildings will, therefore, only be allowed if there is an undisputed agricultural need.

##### Village Rates

Villagers will be pleased to note that rates will be the same for 88-89 as in 87-88. Some small reserve of funds has been built up, and it is intended that some of this should be used to keep the village cleaner.

##### Village Orderly

It is arranged that a village orderly will be employed, on a parttime basis, to keep the village clean. A grant for this is available from Woodspring D.C., and a further grant from them could be obtained, if the mechanical road sweeper was

not used in the village. Because of the irregularity and poor performance of the sweeper, the Council have indicated to Woodspring D.C. that the village would prefer a grant.

#### Footpath to Nature Reserve

To ensure this footpath is retained as such, the support of villagers is essential. Forms are available from Councillors or the Clerks, and users (and particularly long time users) are asked to complete forms and give to Mrs. Hunt (or any Councillor). **DO YOU WANT THIS PATH??!**

#### Telephone Kiosk

It appears that the only safe way to prevent our old red Telephone Box from being replaced is to have it become a listed building. The D.o.E. have been contacted to this end.

#### Traffic through Village

After representations to the local police, they have agreed to periodically check speeds of vehicles passing through the village, especially at times when people are going to, or coming from, work. The local police are also to check on cars parked on the main road, because such parking can make entry to, or exit from, this road very hazardous.

#### Road Improvement Scheme

All the relevant papers for the compulsory purchase orders necessary are now with the D.o.E. They have been requested to expedite these and the Council are pressing Avon C.C. to complete the scheme as soon as possible.

#### Future Meetings

The next meetings will be on 3rd February, 2nd March and 30th March, at 7.30pm in the village hall. As usual villagers can raise matters before the official business starts.
